Angel Gurría, Secretary-General, OECD

Angel Gurría came to the OECD following a distinguished career in public service. As Mexico's Minister of Foreign Affairs from December 1994 to January 1998 he made dialogue and consensus-building one of the hallmarks of his approach to global issues. From January 1998 to December 2000, he was Mexico's Minister of Finance and Public Credit. As OECD Secretary-General, since June 2006, he has reinforced the OECD's role as a hub for global dialogue and debate on economic policy issues while pursuing internal modernisation and reform. Mr. Gurría holds a B.A. degree in Economics from UNAM, Mexico, and a M.A. degree in Economics from Leeds University, United Kingdom.



Adrian Blundell-Wignall, Special Advisor to the OECD Secretary-General on Financial and Enterprise Affairs

Adrian Blundell-Wignall was Director of the OECD Directorate for Financial and Enterprises Affairs from 2014-16 and Deputy Director from 2007-14. He is founder and chairman of a charitable foundation (The Anika Foundation) that raises and invests an endowment fund to provide scholarships in a critical area of healthcare. Mr. Blundell-Wignall is an Australian citizen. He has a 1st class Honours degree and PhD in Economics from Cambridge University, UK. He is the author of extensive publications on financial markets and monetary policy in learned journals and books, as well as broker analyst studies and reports.

Keynote Addresses



Phyllis Borzi, Assistant Secretary of Employment to the US Department of Labor

Phyllis C. Borzi was confirmed on July 10, 2009 as Assistant Secretary of Labor of the Employee Benefits Security Administration (EBSA). EBSA oversees approximately 681,000 private-sector retirement plans, approximately 2.3 million health plans, and a similar number of other welfare benefit plans that provide benefits to approximately 143 million Americans. As agency head, she oversees the administration, regulation and enforcement of Title I of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).



Ambrogio Rinaldi, Director at COVIP and Chair of the OECD Working Party on Private Pensions (WPP)

Ambrogio Rinaldi is Director at COVIP (Commissione di Vigilanza sui Fondi Pensione), the Italian supervisory authority on pension funds, with responsibility in the fields both of daily supervision and of research. Before joining COVIP, he worked many years at Banca d'Italia, the Italian central bank, in the Research Department and then in the supervision of asset management and investment firms. He holds degrees in Economics from the Università di Roma "La Sapienza" and from Harvard University. Since 2003 he has been Chair of the OECD WPP and Member of the Bureau of the OECD Insurance and Private Pensions Committee. He regularly represents COVIP in IOPS and CEIOPS meetings.
